

LIST OF OREGON STATE AWARDS

1. Perpetual trophies for gun champions at the state shoot.
 - a. 12gauge
 - b. 20gauge
 - c. 28gauge
 - d. 410 bore
 - e. HOA
 - f. 12gauge Junior shooter

2. Rookie of the Year (for the previous year)
 - a. Requirements:
 - i. Shooter has to shoot the Oregon State minimums which are 600-12ga, 500-20ga, 28ga and 410 in the first ever year of shooting 4 guns and has achieved the highest average and have shot the State shoot in that year. The Rookie requirement was probably set up this way to encourage 12 gauge shooters to shoot all four guns.
 - b. Award
 - i. A perpetual trophy only given at the State shoot which is a silver-plated loving cup on a wooden base and engraving plates with all of the past winners. The winner takes the trophy home and keeps it for the year, then brings it back to the next year's State shoot with his/her name and year engraved on the perpetual plate.
 - c. Rookie Qualifiers
 - i. All first year 4-gun qualified Oregon Rookies, other than the Rookie of the Year, receive a certificate for their accomplishment.

3. All Star Teams
 - a. 1st Team requirements:
 - i. Shooter must shoot the Oregon minimums (600-12ga, 500-20ga, 28ga & 410) in each gun and shoot at two clubs in Oregon other than their home club and shoot the Oregon State shoot.
 - ii. 1st Team is a 5-person team, which consists of the top five HOA averages for the skeet season. If a shooter has been on this team for the very first time, he/she will receive a vest. If the shooter does not want a vest, then he/she will receive the same patch as the previous years winners receive. If the shooter is a repeat winner, he/she will receive an Oregon shaped patch.
 - b. Class All Star

- i. The requirements are the same as the 1st team all star, except the shooter will have the highest HOA average in Class, from AA through E.
 - ii. The award is a smaller Oregon shaped patch than the 1st team.
- 4. Top Gun Team
 - a. Requirements:
 - i. The team varies in numbers and consists of shooters who have shot the Oregon minimums and increased their average the most from one year to the next.
 - b. Award
 - i. The award is a certificate and in addition a baseball cap with "Top Gun" imprinted on it and the year embroidered on the back. The Captain, meaning the highest average winner, will have the "Captain" embroidered on the back along with the year.
- 5. Carolyn Gullette Memorial "TOP DOG" Award
 - a. Requirements:
 - i. Shoot all four guns at the Oregon State shoot and be an Oregon shooter. After all 4 guns have been shot; we take the scores for the 20 and 410 event and add them together. The highest score in Class C, Class D, and Lady will win. For Class C & D, we use the shooters Class C HOA average, and Class D/E HOA average to determine eligibility in the Class C & D.
- 6. Carolyn Gullette Service Award
 - a. Requirements:
 - i. Outstanding service to OSSA. The recipient could be a shooter or a referee, or a wife, or anyone who contributes much of their time to OSSA, but the award is not for shooting skills. This is not a shooting award. The person does not have to be a member of OSSA.
 - b. This award replaces the Timm Award.
 - c. The recipient receives a silver-plated 8" plate and will have their name, club, and year engraved on the perpetual award.
- 7. 5-Man Oregon State Challenge (12gauge only)
 - a. Requirements:
 - i. All Oregon 12gauge shooters who are shooting at the State shoot. They must specify their club affiliation when they register.

- b. We make a list of all of the shooters by club and after the 12gauge event, we put all of their scores down, choose the 5 highest scores and the highest score wins for that club.
 - c. There is a perpetual plaque that hangs in the previous years clubhouse. The winning club takes the plaque to their club and brings it back the following year with their club name and year engraved.
 - d. This award is intended to create some friendly competition between clubs at the state shoot.
8. Hall of Fame
- a. Requirements:
 - i. The Oregon Hall of fame is instituted to honor those residents of the State of Oregon who have distinguished themselves by a high degree of proficiency in the sport of skeet shooting and/or by major contributions to the promotion and welfare of the sport, exhibiting, in the process, a high degree of sportsmanship and selflessness.
9. Sub-Junior trophy
- a. Requirements:
 - i. A sub-junior shoots the Oregon State shoot. This person can be an in-state or out-of-state shooter.
 - b. The award is a trophy for the shooter to take home and keep.
